Intramural Point System 2007-2008

All activities are divided into three Levels. Level I consist of major team sports, Level II is other team sports and select individual/dual activities, and Level III is all other activities. Teams will be rewarded for participation, level of competition, sportsmanship, and winning. You may also earn points for your organization in the coed division. The point system was design to reward participation, level of competition, and sportsmanship at a higher rate than winning. In this system winning definitely is not everything.

Greek Point System Modifications: Each Fraternity house will be divided into a Crimson or Gray Group depending on the size of the house. Sorority Houses will compete in the same manner as listed above but will only have one group. The following houses will be in the Crimson Group: Alpha Gamma Rho, Alpha Kappa Lambda, Alpha Tau Omega, Beta Theta Pi, Delta Chi, Delta Tau Delta, Phi Gamma Delta, Phi Kappa Theta, Pi Kappa Alpha, Sigma Nu, and Theta Chi. The Fraternities in the Gray Group are Delta Sigma Phi, Delta Upsilon, FarmHouse, Kappa Sigma, Lambda Chi Alpha, Phi Delta Theta, Phi Kappa Sigma, Phi Kappa Tau, Phi Sigma Kappa, Sigma Chi, Tau Kappa Epsilon, Theta Xi. Based on each semester on the total number of points accumulated from the point system below each Chapter will earn additional points towards the Greek Awards presented by IFC and Panhellenic. The points awarded will be given out as follows:

1st and 2nd - 5 points towards Semester Awards
3rd and 4th - 4 points
5th and 6th - 3 points
7th and 8th - 2 points
9th and 10th - 1 point

*In order to gain any points towards Semester Awards, Chapters must accumulate points in at least 2 events.

Point System Process:

- Obtain information online or at the SRC about all activities/registration dates.
- Sign-up team/individual during registration period.
- Circle appropriate living unit on registration form (MEN/WOMEN-at least 75% of the members must be from that living unit/COED-at least 75% of the gender from the living unit must be represented on the team; teams may have a female and male living unit represented on the same coed team).
- Participants will be awarded points based on the league/playoffs in which they actually participate
- If divisions are combined for any event, points will be awarded based on the competitive point scale (see below)
- Points will be totaled at the end of each set of sports (twice a semester) to update the results based on the procedure below.

Level I:

Activities: Basketball League, 3 on 3 Basketball League, Flag Football League, 4 on 4 Flag Football League, Outdoor Soccer League, 5 on 5 Soccer League, Fall Softball League, Indoor Volleyball League, Dodgeball League, Indoor Soccer League, and Spring Softball League

Competitive: 60 participation points (reduced by 30 pts. after every forfeit)

* Any team receiving a red card will lose all sportsmanship points, and be assessed a penalty of -20 pts for each red card. For example, if a team receives two yellow cards, they would go from 40 sportsmanship points to 20. If they then received a red card, they would lose 20 points for the red card and 40 points for not achieving the sportsmanship bonus. The net result would be -40 points because of poor sportsmanship. Any points awarded for participation, placement, and playoffs would still be applied. However, any team eliminated from league play will not receive any participation points, placement points, playoff points, or sportsmanship points and all penalty points for yellow and red cards would still apply.

(Only the 4 best Individuals/Teams for each hall/chapter will score points)

Level II:

Activities: Tennis League, 4 on 4 Outdoor Sand Volleyball Tournament, Ultimate Disc Tournament, Racquetball League, Wiffleball Tournament, UI/WSU 2 Person Golf Scramble, 4 on 4 Volleyball League, Badminton League, and Team Tennis Tournament

Competitive: 40 participation points (reduced by 20 pts. after each forfeit)

Placement Points:

5 points 1st place

4 points 2nd place

3 points 3rd or 4th place

Recreational: 20 participation points (reduced by 20 pts. after every forfeit)

Placement Points:

3 points 1st place

2 points 2nd place

1 points 3rd or 4th place

(Only the 4 best Individuals/Teams for each hall/ chapter will score points)

Level III:

Activities: All other activities offered

Competitive: 10 participation points (no participation points if forfeit occurs)

Placement Points:

5 points 1st place

4 points 2nd place

3 points 3rd or 4th place

Recreational: 5 participation points (no participation points if forfeit occurs)

Placement Points:

3 points 1st place

2 points 2nd place

1 points 3rd or 4th place

(Only the 4 best Individuals/Teams for each hall/ chapter will score points)
